THE M74 SPECIAL ROAD (FULLARTON ROAD TO M8 WEST OF KINGSTON BRIDGE) SPECIAL ROAD AND CONNECTING ROADS SCHEME 2005.

THE M74 SPECIAL ROAD (FULLARTON ROAD TO M8 WEST OF KINGSTON BRIDGE) SIDE ROADS ORDER 2005

NOTICE IS HEREBY GIVEN, that the Scottish Ministers have made the following Scheme and Order in connection with the construction of a new length of the M74 Special Road between Fullarton Road and the M8 west of Kingston Bridge:

- a. a Scheme under Section 7 as read with sections 8, 10(1) and 143(1) of the Roads (Scotland) Act 1984, to provide for the construction of a new length of special road, connecting roads and slip roads;
- b. an Order under section 9(1)(c), as read with sections 70(1) and 143(1) of the Roads (Scotland) Act 1984, to provide for the construction of new side roads, the improvement of certain existing roads to form new and improved connections in relation to the new special road; the stopping up of various existing roads; the stopping up of various means of access; and the provision of certain new means of access.

COPIES of the made scheme, order and plans referred to therein may be inspected, free of charge, during normal business hours, from 1 April 2005 until 13 May 2005 at the offices of the Scottish Executive Enterprise, Transport and Lifelong Learning Department, Victoria Quay, Edinburgh; Glasgow City Council, Richmond Exchange, 20 Cadogan Street, Glasgow; South Lanarkshire Council, Q & A Office, Main Street, Rutherglen and South Lanarkshire Council, Montrose House, 154 Montrose Crescent, Hamilton and may be seen there without payment of fee from Monday to Friday between the hours of 08.45 and 16.45. This material has also been deposited at Govanhill Library, 170 Langside Road, Glasgow and may be seen there without payment of fee on Monday and Tuesday between the hours of 10.00 and 20.00, Wednesday between the hours of 10.00 and 17.00 hours, Thursday between the hours of 12.00 and 20.00 and Friday and Saturday between the hours of 09.00 and 17.00.

ANY PERSON aggrieved by the Scheme or Order, who desires to question the validity thereof, or of any provisions therein on the grounds that they are not within the powers of the Roads (Scotland) Act 1984 or that any requirement of the said Act has not been complied with in relation to the Orders may within 6 weeks of 1 April 2005 make application to the Court of Session for the suspension of the operation of, or the quashing of, the Orders or any provision contained therein.
