## Sectoral Priorities

- 6. The group undertook a workshop exercise to identify the key issues affecting individuals' sectors. The key issues were then grouped and prioritised by theme.
- 7. The results of the exercise were:
  - 1. <u>Physical Road Network Condition</u>
    - Road width
    - Verge and ditch maintenance
    - Narrow roads/tight turns time and difficulty for manoeuvring
    - Width; vegetation; narrows e.g. bridges; pot holes; soft verges
    - Narrow rural roads poor access
    - Weak rural roads
  - 1b. Additional Operating Costs
    - Wear and tear to vehicles from poor roads
    - High fuel consumption on rural roads
  - 1c. <u>Centralisation/Distance from Market</u>
    - Costs Distance from market
    - Reducing number of processors (sawmills) distance increases; cost increases = price drops
    - Centralisation of processors

### 2. <u>Resilience</u>

- Long detours
- A83 (key route to Islay, Jura and Campbeltown) long diversion for HGVs
- No winter maintenance of minor roads
- Roads maintenance, especially of minor roads
- Bio security
- 3. Freight Conflict with communities and other road users
  - Community complaints about lorries
  - Vehicle movements through villages
  - Competition with other users tourism/commuters
  - Inconsiderate cyclists
  - Increase in walkers, cyclists etc.
  - Objections from communities to heavy freight grain/timber wagons

# 4. <u>Consideration by all levels of government and regulations – lack of joined up thinking</u>

- Inconsistent application of working time regulations
- Legislation
- Food and drink targets and woodland expansion targets not being linked to transport infrastructure necessary to deliver
- Lack of provision for agricultural vehicles/lack of understanding by Transport Scotland and local authorities
- Planning/infrastructure levy
- 5. Road efficiency trunk/rural roads and restrictions/improvements
  - Clash between agricultural vehicles and faster vehicles
  - Slow trunk roads
  - Dualling of trunk roads A9 welcome A95/A941/A82/A83 passing points
- 6. <u>Miscellaneous</u>
  - Price of product dropped through the floor since crop planted. Economics changed
  - Shortage of drivers for livestock haulage
  - Driver retention
  - Active signs on more roads. Brown signs
  - Ferry capacity/links Islay ferry
  - Road network within the forest not extensive enough
